SUMMARY OF THE FOUNDATION'S MILESTONES & ACHIEVEMENTS

| 1989 🥊 | June signing of Trust Deed establishing the Foundation. |

| 1990 🤇 | Official launch of Foundation on 30 March 1990 at Jakades Reception Centre. First donation was made by Horsham and District United Friendly Society of \$50,000. \$80,000 was raised to 30/6/1990. |
| 1993 🕻 | 180 contributions received totalling \$36,000. Total accumulated funds \$137,000. 1993 Christmas appeal which was individually coloured by local school children and received 138 responses totalling \$4,530. |
| 1994 (| "Foundationer" House in Fraser Drive Horsham was constructed, which saw many local businesses, tradespeople, community groups and local council working together to raise funds for the Foundation. The sale of the house and land package resulted in over \$22,000 injected into the Foundation bringing the total to \$154,000 as at 30 June 1994. First Great Wimmera River Duck Race held at Kannamaroo with 2,000 ducks. |
| 1995 | Total Foundation funds nearly \$200,000. |
| 1997 | Donated \$40,000 towards Kurrajong Lodge. |
| 2002 | Donated \$50,000 towards Rotary House. NB The building of Rotary House was to mark the 75th birthday of Rotary Horsham. |
| 2009 🤇 | Due to growth of the Foundation, meetings were increased from 2 per year to bi-monthly. |
| 2010 🤇 | WBH Foundation first strategic plan was completed including a communication and marketing plan and a comprehensive investment strategy. A new vision statement to create 'the gift that keeps on giving' was adopted and to raise \$1 million in capital by 2014. |

2011

Engaged the services of Robyn Lardner and Bronwyn Clarke to assist with review and refresh branding including a change of name to Wimmera Health Care Group Foundation. New logo was designed to reflect the changes.

Foundation 500 initiative was introduced. Donors commit \$500 (gold) or \$1,000 (platinum) per year for four years. 57 individuals and businesses committed to Foundation500 as at 30 June.

Franz and Rhonda Tursi were the first donors to pledge their support and continue to be active donors today.

A Mastercook competition and gala charity dinner was organised by Robyn and Bronwyn and was held to celebrate the 21st year of the Foundation, raising in excess of \$51,000. The dinner was held at the Horsham RSL which was transformed into an Italian restaurant with guest celebrity chef, Stefano di Pieri.

The Mastercook competition lifted the profile of the Foundation, with 28 teams participating in a cooking competition, raising funds for their respective team and cook offs at the Horsham Plaza. At the time, delegates estimated the cooking competition and charity dinner had reached approximately one third of the Horsham population.

Volunteers came together to assist with the event and it was from this that Friends of the Foundation, (FOFz) the fundraising arm of the Foundation was established in August 2011, nominating Allison Roberts as the Co-ordinator.

Funds raised by the Foundation in 2010/2011 financial year were \$79,517.

2012 🔵 Website was launched.

FOFz organised Mastercook2 and was the major focus in fundraising for 2012, raising \$73,040.
